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Legal Research Community Authoring Project (LRCAP)

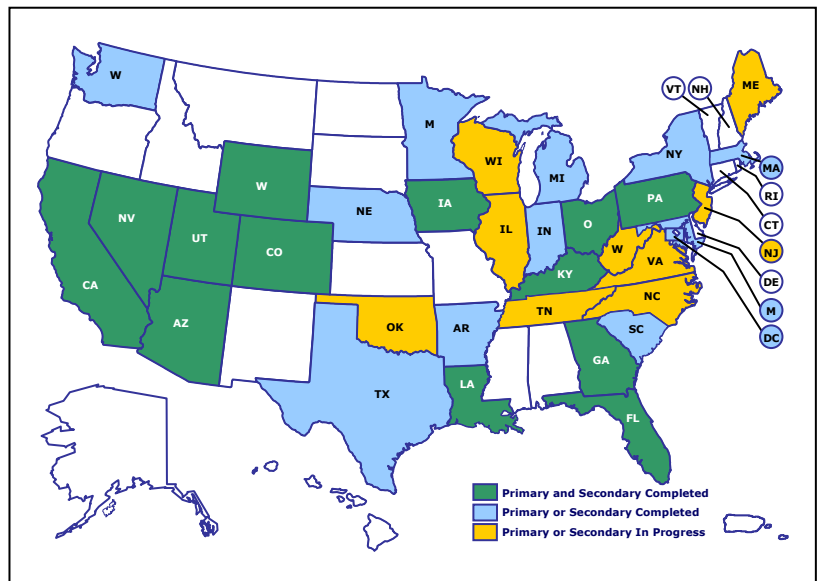
Help us expand a library of over 100 computer-based educational materials on legal research. **Author a legal research CALI lesson.**
