


# Rulemaking: Federal Register and CFR

## ACROSS

- 2) This part of a CFR entry lists the statutory authority for the rule (two words, no space).
- 4) Both Direct Final Rulemaking and Interim Final Rulemaking rely on what exemption to § 553 (two words, no space).
- 9) The Federal Register (FR) is the official \_\_\_ of the United States Government.
- 10) The method by which a president can change the administrative process (two words, no space).
- 12) The CFR and USC are arranged by subject areas called \_\_\_.

- 3) Final Rules are published in this section of the Federal Register (three words, no space).
- 5) When Congress enacted the \_\_\_ Act in 1946, it was the first time it had adopted rulemaking procedures (two words, no space).
- 6) Where to find a complete transcript of House and Senate debates and activities (two words, no space).
- 7) This part of a CFR entry identifies where the final rule is published in the Federal Register (two words, no space).
- 8) Most Final Rules are effective \_\_\_ days after publication in the Federal Register.
- 11) Be aware when using a service such as e-CFR or federalregister.gov because these are not \_\_\_ versions of the relevant sources.
