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If your proposal is accepted, we'll take your work, make it readable on all popular reading gadgets, and share it with the law school world. We'll even pay you a \$500 stipend for each chapter you write. Details below:

- Submit a one-page proposal to CALI for review and approval by an editorial committee.
- You must be tenured or tenure track faculty at a CALI member US law school.
- We pay you \$500 upon completion of each chapter. All work will reviewed by an editorial board.
- If you're not in it for the money, you can donate your work to the project.
- **CALI will openly share your work** with other law school faculty, students, and even the public. Anyone will be able to adopt and use your work for absolutely free. Think of the long-term good you could do for your legal education community.
- We will **actively promote and recognize you and your work** for breaking new ground as one of the first contributors to open, digital, legal education materials.

For this project, we define a "chapter" as the amount of material that a student is expected to read in preparation for one hour of class. We ask that your finalized chapters include teaching notes and end-of-chapter comments and questions to assist other faculty in the adoption of your material for their courses. There are limited funds available so we won't be able to accept every proposal.
